She had just moved back to Colorado to be closer to family and enrolled her youngest son into Head Start in Wheat Ridge.

Rhiannon's first goal was to complete her associate's degree, but she felt very overwhelmed with the idea of navigating the university system. JPP coaches were there for Rhiannon every step of the process, from completing paperwork, re-testing, FASFA, and filing taxes to enrolling in courses and paying for tuition, rent, and books.

"When I enrolled at Red Rocks, I was fortunate to have supportive teachers who encouraged me to continue my education and complete a four-year degree in science and physics. JPP and Red Rocks worked together with the School of Mines to secure a transfer scholarship to make that possible."



Rhiannon's persistence and determination, along with the support of family, friends, and local organizations have helped her design and achieve lofty goals while caring for her children and giving back to the community. Rhiannon is passionate about encouraging others to push through obstacles, surpass their limitations, and become all that they are made to be.

In 2023, Rhiannon graduated from the School of Mines with her Master's in Applied Optical Physics and accepted a position at Lockheed Martin. Her goal is to work locally in the optics industry while continuing to volunteer at her church and stay involved in both of her boys academic and extracurricular pursuits.

She is a current member of the NAACP Branch of Aurora, and has recently joined the board for a community program called MetroDEEP, which focuses on increasing the social, economic, and well-being of communities of African descent. At Family Tree, she has taken many leadership roles to continue conversations and efforts on diversity, equity, and inclusion.

Some of Rynn's future goals include furthering her education, supporting her husband's dream of providing accessible mental health services to the community, buying a home, and being involved in more community engagement opportunities. Rynn is always seeking new ways to grow, both personally and professionally, and will continue to seek development opportunities and access her areas of growth. I have been a member of JPP for nearly six years now. I was skeptical when I first joined JPP, as that is just my nature to move into anything new. Rikki, my coach, changed my mind pretty quickly in that first meeting when she asked me to describe to her my ideal life.

I was so surprised to be asked that kind of question! I felt like I was being seen as a real human being and not just a case number. I told them I planned to get my certification in medical billing and coding because I knew that it had remote options, and I wanted to have a flexible work schedule as a single parent of two young boys. She asked about my prior education, and I mentioned that I had been pursuing a degree in interior design, before having kids. She encouraged me to, "just see how much you lack to get your degree." I only needed about 12 credits.

With Rikki by my side, I went to meet with financial aid and see what it would cost to finish my schooling. She also talked me back into it after discovering the cost, and helped me work out a plan to pay as I went.

JPP even connected me with grants to help pay for my schooling, and I graduated with my Bachelor's with no added debt (aside from what I already had from attending before when I was more naive and didn't have such amazing guidance).

I am now working in the field I love, at a job I adore, with people who feel more like a family than coworkers. It's amazing! I am now, with Rikki's support and encouragement, working on saving to buy a home. I think the thing I love most about JPP is that they treat me like a person, like Leah. They didn't just throw resources my way and wish me luck. They asked me, "What do YOU want? How are YOU going to accomplish that? And what can WE do to support you? And once that goal is completed, there is much celebration followed by a "What's next?"

It's like having a group of friends who are constantly pushing you to move out of your comfort zone and into your true potential.


